

Accelerating materials discovery with AI

On the 12th of June Dr Elena Patyukova and Dr Andrij Vasylenko from the University of Liverpool Chemistry Department visited to introduce Year 12 students to the recent progress of Al and deep learning and how this enables a new way of approaching solving scientific problems. The talk focused on the global challenge of batteries, and on the search for new compounds of Lithium suitable for a new type of solid-state battery. Students learned how, by utilising machine learning, researchers can significantly speed up the process of finding possible new compounds that can then be tested further to assess suitability. Students from a range of subjects attended the talk because this topic is one example of how the most exciting research relies on knowledge and skills from across disciplines, and demonstrates the importance of collaboration.







Culture and Future Day

Last week, Year 12 took part in a Culture and Future's day. Students shared their cultures by attending school in their traditional dress. We started the morning with a presentation from Sudhana a Buddhist monk, He explained the meaning of Buddhism and delivered a session on guided meditation. Students enjoyed a Chinese banquet for lunch whilst Amina an Arabic poet shared some stories of her life and poems with them. Liz Folan from Sunrise Psychology came in the afternoon and gave a presentation on Positive Psychology. Zoe from Agent Academy talked about opportunities at Agent. At the end of the day, Ian Lomas did a presentation on Ask Apprenticeships.
