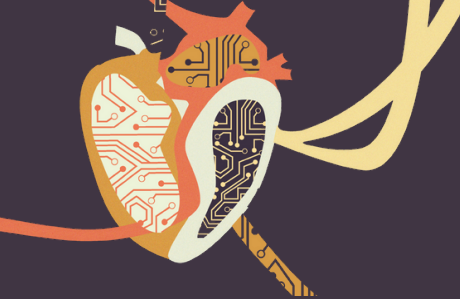

### The only way is UP! Reminder

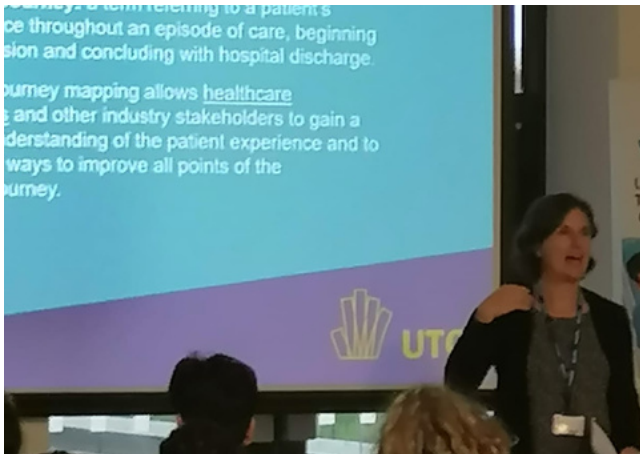

### APEX Digital Health Conference

Healthcare and Biology students from Years 12 and 13 travelled to UTC Sheffield yesterday to attend the APEX Digital Healthcare Conference, organised by Baker Dearing Trust. Students enjoyed meeting academics and business partners, and took part in workshops including one delivered by Doncaster University sports physiotherapists in which students (and staff!) tested out their balance and calculated the force of their grip. This year's APEX challenge was launched, and the students are now beginning to work on their entries for this competition. The stakes are high... we won 1st, 2nd and 3rd last year!

### Efficiency and Sustainability in Engineering with Beverston

This week, students had the opportunity to discover how data is used to improve the efficiency and sustainability of manufacturing during a visit to Beverston, a precision engineering business who use Mazak CNC machines and Autodesk Fusion 360 to produce parts for the pharmaceutical and aerospace industry.



### Robots in Computing

Year 10 have been using programmable Kitronik robots to visually represent key concepts of coding skills at KS4 in Computer Science this week. These sessions are bespoke and have been developed specifically for use this year.
